Los Angeles County's Ordinance



Purpose of the Organic Waste Ordinance

- Reduce disposal of organic waste and its impact on the environment
- Comply with CalRecycle's requirements with SB 1383

Ordinance Summary

- Requires organic waste collection service for everyone
- Establishes self-hauler requirements
- Requires large edible food generating business to recover/donate excess edible food
- Establishes reporting requirements for Edible Food Recovery Organizations
- Establishes enforcement procedures such as correction notices and penalties

The purpose of the County's ordinance is not only to comply with State law but to keep organic waste out of landfills to reduce methane emissions and the impact of climate change.

The ordinance will require everyone to have organic waste collection service unless a waiver is granted, The ordinance will also establish requirements for self-hauling, self-haulers, edible food recovery organizations, food recovery and donation requirements, as well as allowing the County the ability to inspect or request records for proof of compliance.

The ordinance will establish the process for enforcing compliance requirements, which during the first 2 years will consist of monitoring, education, assistance, and correction notices to persons not complying.

Beginning in 2024, after 2 years of implementation, notices not corrected may result in penalties.

Residents, Businesses and Multi-Family Property Owners

As mentioned, the ordinance will require residents, business, and/or property owners in unincorporated LA County to maintain organic waste collection service from their hauler. Each waste hauler could potentially have slight differences to the service they provide and types of organic waste they accept in the container.

You also have the option of self-management of your organic waste. This means that you could manage your organic waste on-site such as backyard composting for residents or in-vessel composting for businesses.

It also means that you could self-haul your organic waste to an organic waste processing facility.

Additionally, businesses and multi-family property owners are responsible for providing educational material to tenants or employees to ensure they comply with maintaining organic waste collection service.

UWS Organics Services

- Residents will maintain their 3 bins
Green for yard waste, blue for recycling, and black for trash and organic waste.

Residents will maintain their 3 bins,

Green for yard waste, blue for recycling, and black for garbage/trash as well as organics waste.

UWS will be taking the trash contents to a high diversion processing facility where food and other organic waste will be extracted from the trash instead of being disposed in a landfill.

The extracted organic waste will then be sent to an anaerobic digestion facility where the gases generated are fully captured and converted into energy or fuels.

There will be no change in the way waste is collected or the way you treat your organic waste.

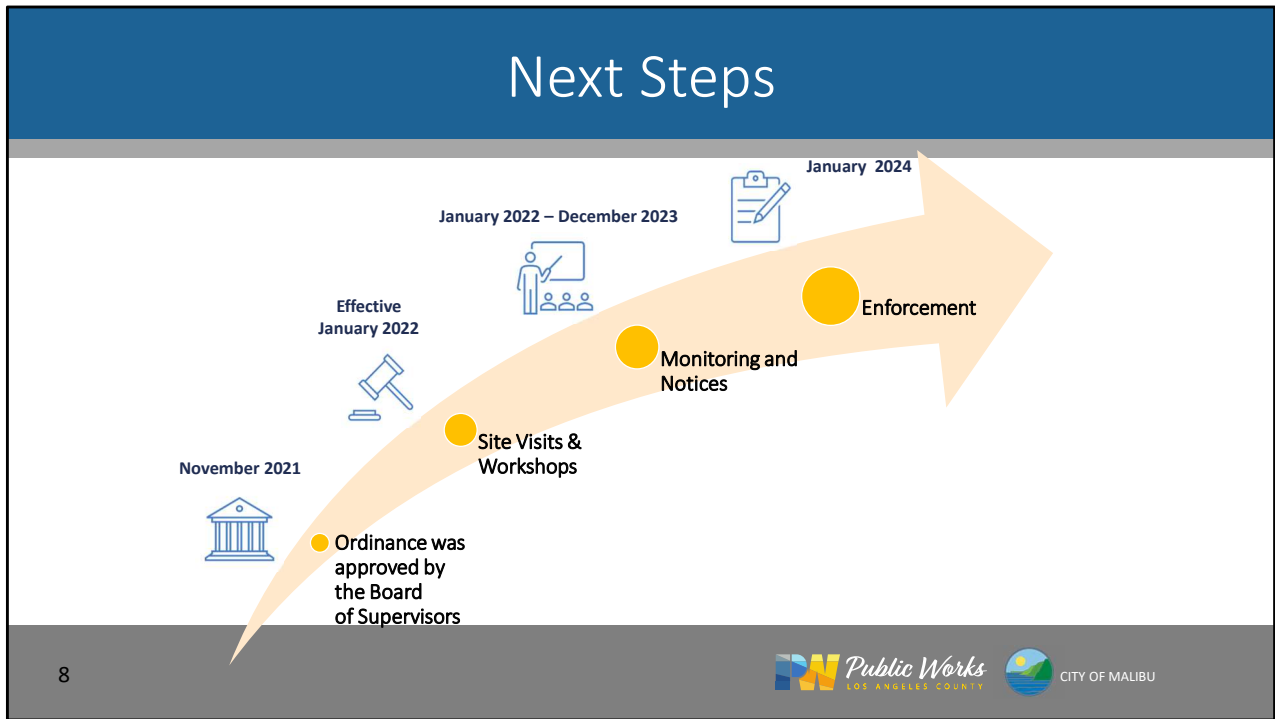
